CANCER LEGAL RESOURCE CENTER SEMINAR TOPICS

Overview: Cancer Legal Resource Center

This is an introduction to our history, our mission, and the services we offer to cancer patients, their families, healthcare providers and caregivers. Suggested time: 15-30 minutes

Overview: Cancer-Related Legal Issues (available in Spanish)

In this presentation we discuss the most pertinent legal issues for cancer patients and survivors, including access to health insurance; employment rights and reasonable accommodations in the workplace; and access to disability insurance and government benefits, such as Medicare, Medi-Cal, Supplemental Security Income (SSI), and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI). Suggested time: 45 minutes – 2 hours

Health Insurance: This is a seminar on the health insurance options available to people with pre-existing medical conditions and coverage issues. These options include COBRA, Cal-COBRA, the Health Insurance Premium Payment Program (HIPP), the Health Insurance Portability & Accountability Act (HIPAA), the Major Risk Medical Insurance Plan (MRMIP), Medi-Cal, Medicare, the Women's Health & Cancer Rights Act (WHCRA) and pertinent California healthcare legislation. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 hour

Employment: In this comprehensive overview we cover the rights and protections of people in the workplace under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the California Fair Employment and Housing Act (FEHA), and the Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA). Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 hour

Estate Planning: The purpose of this seminar is to help cancer patients and their families prepare for any potential situation by planning ahead to ensure that their loved ones and assets are protected. It provides an overview of advanced health care directives, power of attorney for financial affairs, conservatorships, wills and trusts. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 hour

Government Benefits: This is a presentation on the government benefits available to people who are temporarily or permanently unable to work, and what eligibility requirements they must meet under Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Supplemental Security Income (SSI), State Disability Insurance (SDI), and California Family Temporary Disability Insurance (FTDI). Suggested time: 30 – 45 minutes

How to Pay for Your Treatment: Learn tips on how to deal with and pay for your medical bills, avoid negative effects on your credit history, and information on your consumer rights. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 hour

Medi-Cal: This seminar gives an overview of the Medi-Cal program in California, including how to qualify for Medi-Cal, the Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Program (BCCTP), In-Home Supportive Services (IHSS), and programs for seniors and people with disabilities. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 ½ hours

Medicare: This presentation covers all aspects of Medicare coverage, including standard Medicare, Medicare/Medi-Cal, Medigap plans, Medicare Advantage plans, eligibility for clinical trials and preventive services under Medicare, and the new Medicare Part D prescription drug plan. Suggested time: 1 – 2 hours

Navigating Through Managed Care: Discover effective ways to deal with your health insurance provider to get care you need. Learn about your rights with respect to accessing your medical records, second opinions, and the Independent Medical Review process in California. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 ½ hours

Taking Time Off Work: Learn about the Family & Medical Leave Act, State leave laws, and government benefits available to people who are temporarily or permanently unable to work. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 hour

Legislative Advocacy: Examine how to affect legislative change as an individual or in small groups. We discuss pending legislation, how cancer and disability organizations participate in the legislative process, and how to contact and effectively communicate with the elected officials. Suggested time: 45 minutes – 1 ½ hours

“Ask the CLRC” Clinic: In this clinic we provide an opportunity to meet with our staff attorney(s) at your location to discuss individual questions on legal rights and obligations. The clinic can be paired with a seminar, and meetings with our attorney(s) may be scheduled by appointment only, on a walk-in basis, or both.

MCLE: Elimination of Bias Continuing Legal Education - an overview of the rights of employees with cancer in legal offices and how to assist with cancer-related legal issues on the CLRC's Professional Panel. Time: 1 hour

MCLE: General Continuing Legal Education - an overview of cancer-related legal issues and how to participate on the CLRC's Professional Panel. Suggested time: 1 – 2 hours
