Upcoming Title V Needs Assessment - Dr. Michele Cheung

- The Title V Maternal and Child Health Block Grant provides core funding to California to improve the health and well-being of mothers, infants, children and youth, including children and youth with special health care needs and their families
- California is required to complete a comprehensive needs assessment on the health and well-being of the MCAH population every 5 years
- Each local health jurisdiction (LHJ) completes a local needs assessment every 5 years and uses the results to plan local programs. CDPH MCAH compiles all the LHJ information to develop the statewide needs assessment
- All OCPC members will be invited to participate
 - o Identify who in your organization best to represent
 - Suggest additional participants
 - Think about what are some of the local health issues affecting the MCAH population to prioritize work on?

Plans of Safe Care updates – Dianna Daly, First 5 Consultant

- County of Orange Social Services Agency and First 5 Orange County were awarded the in-Depth Technical Assistance (IDTA) program in May 2023
- Through the IDTA program, Orange County is working with the National Center on Substance Abuse and Child Welfare (NCSACW) to develop a comprehensive framework for Plans of Safe Care (POSC) that will:
 - Improve outcomes for infants and families affected by prenatal substance exposure
 - Support the recovery of pregnant and parenting individuals and their families
 - Develop policies and protocols that support intervention during the prenatal period.
 - Reduce the number of infant removals due to parental substance use
- Project Goals:
 - Reduce stigma and discrimination by identifying and implementing methods to establish trust between the community, child welfare, service delivery providers, and

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the judicial system

- Increase the coordination of care and the implementation of Plans of Safe Care by developing and implementing protocols between partners that formalize how partner agencies will interact with, serve, and improve outcomes for families impacted by parental substance use and infants effected by prenatal exposure to substances
- Improve data collection and exchange with a racial/ethnic equity lens
- Increase access to care and services by cultivating a family-centered focus of treatment and support
- o The October 16th and 17th summit will be held at the Behavioral Health Training Center

Pasteurized Donor Human Milk Provision in California NICUs – Lisa Stellwagen, MD FAAP – Executive and Medical Director, UC Health Milk Bank – UC San Diego Health

- o Goal is to reduce disparities within the state
- There is now enough milk to meet the needs and the critical issue is lack of hospital adoption
- Dr. Cheung will provide Dr. Stellwagen with Lucy Van Otterloo's contact information as she would be a great resource for OC hospitals

Nurse-Family Partnership®: Marcia Salomon, SPHN & Robyn Baran, SPHN- OCHCA

- Capacity: 10 nurses/250 clients
- Current caseload: 153 clients (increase of 43 clients since April)
- Current availability: 72 clients
- Challenges: school referrals have decreased
- Visited many OB providers
- Highlights from this quarter:
 - Implementing POSC with clients
 - Two-day Maternal Mental Health Training
 - First graduations since returning from Covid Response
 - Hired a new experienced NFP nurse
 - Serving a hearing impaired client with an ASL interpreter
