## VACCINE FACTS & TIPS



**FACT:** According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, COVID-19 mRNA vaccines such as Moderna and Pfizer do not change or interact with your DNA in any way. These vaccines deliver instructions (genetic material) to our cells to start building protection against the virus that causes COVID-19. However, the material never enters the nucleus of the cell, which is where our DNA is kept. [Learn more.](#)



**FACT:** According to the FDA, available information suggests that the authorized vaccines remain effective in protecting the American public against currently circulating strains of COVID-19. The FDA is already talking with vaccine manufacturers about these new strains and how to quickly and safely make any changes that may be needed in the future. [Learn more.](#)



**TIP:** The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends you wait at least 14 days after your COVID-19 vaccine before getting any other vaccine, including a flu or shingles vaccine. Or if you have recently received any other vaccine first, wait at least 14 days before getting your COVID-19 vaccine. [Learn more.](#)

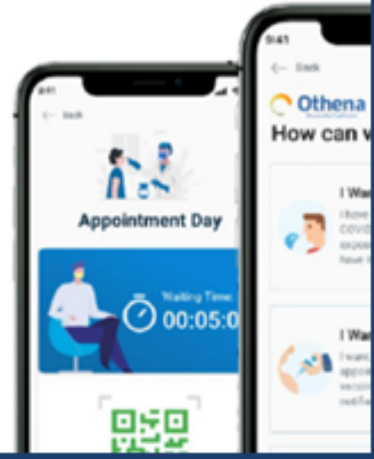
