1736 Family Crisis Center (1736FCC) – RRH for Homeless Veterans project was recommended for reallocation given that during the last three reporting periods the project had consistently scored 50 percent across the project performance measures and had significant unspent funds at the closing of the three grant terms resulting in over \$220,000 being recaptured by HUD. 1736FCC was notified via email on October 18, 2021, of the reallocation recommendation and provided the CoC Board meeting information. The recommendation was approved by the CoC Board during the October 27, 2021, meeting. Following the CoC Board meeting, 1736FCC was notified of the CoC Board's approval to reallocate the funding and provided the appeals process. 1736FCC did not submit an appeal.
