SUBJECT:	Mental Health & Recovery Services (MHRS) Update for April 2022

Adult and Older Adult Mental Health & Recovery Services (MHRS)

Outpatient Services: The county operated **Program of Assertive Community Treatment** (**PACT**) teams have begun the process of informing clients of the new Enhanced Care Management (ECM) benefit available to them and enrolling those who are interested in the benefit. Once enrolled the PACT clinicians provide ongoing ECM services focused primarily on housing and coordinating various medical services such as, dental health, primary care health, etc.

Office of Suicide Prevention (OSP)

The **Community Suicide Prevention Initiative (CSPI)** in Orange County (OC) recently developed a Firearm Safety Brochure as part of their **Lethal Means Safety Initiative**. This initiative focuses on reducing access to lethal means or methods used for suicide during times of crisis, also known as "means safety", one of the most effective evidence-based strategies for suicide prevention. The CSPI Coalition has adopted a multilevel approach which includes providing suicide prevention education to local gun shops and range staff, as well as having firearm distributors provide suicide prevention materials with each firearm sale such as the Firearm safety Brochure. This was a multi-agency collaboration including representatives from the City of Seal Beach, Hecht Trauma Institute, Mind OC, American Foundation of Suicide Prevention (AFSP) community members and the OSP. California Mental Health Services Act (CalMHSA) provided technical assistance. More information at: (www.stopfirearmsuicideoc.org)

A new data dashboard featuring information on deaths by suicide was created for the purpose of raising community awareness and strategic planning of suicide prevention efforts in Orange County. Having a better understanding of this data can support where the County places efforts and resources to work towards suicide prevention. The dashboard will allow users to search, sort and view data, charts, and maps by filtering the suicide self-harm and deaths data over time by age, gender, race, method of suicide and place of death. The information, which is sourced through the California Comprehensive Death File, is updated monthly.. The Dashboard was developed through a collaboration of several HCA departments, including the OSP, Office of Project
