- 882 COVID-19 cases in Orange County
- 14 COVID-19 deaths in Orange County
- 556 people tested by HCA Public Health Lab (PHL) and commercial labs since yesterday
- Total number of people tested by PHL and by commercial labs to date is 10,489
- HCA PHL has kits available to test 950 specimens
- FDA Pacific Southwest Food and Feed Laboratory (Irvine) donated 250 extraction reagents to PHL on Friday.
- PHL is working with the AOC to add extraction kits to the list of requested donations to see if local universities may have supplies to donate.

ALTERNATE CARE SITE – FAIRVIEW / FAIRGROUNDS

- OC HCA subject matter experts in acute care operations on site w/ State Project Lead for Fairview. Below is summary of 2-day visit:
 - The Fairview site planning is turning more into a low level federal medical station (Shelter) which is way less than an alternate care site. They told our team that it's an ACS but consider it to function as a shelter. Initial for 520 beds, 6 buildings in 20 calendar days (4/23 up & running)
 - FMS – low level care, CDC tier 1-2, cots-no beds, no privacy, all ambulatory, no ADA, no O2, no monitoring, one nurse to 31 patient, no lab, no X-ray, no special diets
- Fairgrounds remains an option should we require additional space
