






9-1-1 ambulance transport volume continues to increase over the last 30 days. Volume is approaching normal (pre-COVID) levels but most of the increase has occurred in the last two (2) weeks (Updated 12/15/20).



Non-emergency ambulance transports declined yesterday, but continue to average about 15-20% below normal (pre-COVID) levels overall (Updated 12/15/20).

- Fourteen (14) ERCs had APOT times greater than sixty (60) minutes.









MOBILE FIELD HOSPITALS

- MFHs are capable of expanding current hospital capacity by adding additional patient beds.
- They are large heavy duty canvas tents with hard flooring and temperature controlled units.
- They can be configured in a myriad of footprints and sizes (i.e. 25-200 bed).
- CDPH is primed and ready to provide hospitals a waiver to allow emergency use of this MFH facility.
- OCEMS is actively deploying multiple MFHs to OC hospitals prepared to receive & operate
 - OCEMS has a total of 8 trailers to support at minimum, 200 patient beds.
 - o Hospitals who have self-identified in receiving a MFH include:
 - UCI (50 bed) confirmed
 - St. Jude (25 bed) confirmed
 - Fountain Valley (50 bed) confirmed
 - o Hoag Newport (50 bed) not confirmed
 - o St. Joseph (25 bed) not confirmed
