

Prior to today...

- Sept 2020 Gov. Newsom signs SB-803, to enact into law starting in 2021
- Jan 2021 to Jun 2021 DHCS hosts listening sessions to establish guidelines
- July 2021 BHIN on PSS Certification program standards issued
- Nov 2021 CalMHSA submits implementation plan to DHCS
- Mar 2022 to June 2022 DHCS presented on implementation for DMC/SMHS
- May 2022 CalMHSA launches certification website, allocates scholarships
- Oct 2022 Early test takers take certification exam

Important things to remember

County Opt-in

Gov. Newsom signed SB-803 once revisions were made to not burden State budget and therefore it became a County-by-County opt-in program.

List of participating Counties can be found on DHCS website.

Medi-Cal Peer Support Specialist

PSS becomes a new provider type that can provide distinct set of services under Medi-Cal.

OC has opted into implementation for both DMC-ODS and SMHS.

Certifying entity and representing entity: CalMHSA

CalMHSA has been identified as State's certifying entity responsible for certification, examination and enforcement of professional standards.

Currently, OC and most counties are being represented by CalMHSA.

Minimum Qualifications

- 1. Be at least 18 years of age
- 2. Possess a high school diploma or equivalent degree
- 3. Self-identify as having experience with the process of recovery from a mental illness or substance use disorder, either as a consumer of these services or as the parent, caregiver or family member of one
- 4. Be willing to share their experience as a person with lived experience
- 5. Have a strong dedication to recovery
- 6. Agree, in writing, to adhere to the DHCS PSS Code of Ethics
- 7. Successfully complete the training requirements for a peer support specialist
- 8. Pass the certification examination

Grandparenting Requirements

Individuals <u>currently</u> employed in a peer role can get grandparented if they meet these additional requirements:

- 1. Be employed as a peer specialist as of January 1, 2022
- 2. Have 1550 hours as peer specialist in 1 year <u>or</u> 1550 hours in 3 years, with 500 hours completed within the last 12 months
- 3. Completed 20 hours of CE in the last 2 years, including 6 hours in law and ethics
- 4. Completed a Peer training
- 5. Provide three letters of recommendation from supervisor, colleague/ professional, and one self-recommendation

Certification Scholarships

- Issued by DHCS, scholarships covers fees for: application, training and exam
- Currently intended for County peer workforce recommended by County
- 5000 Statewide scholarships, 336 allocated for Orange County
- Nov 30, 2022 Deadline for Counties to submit recommendations
- Dec 31, 2022 Deadline to submit application for peers
- Awardees have 12-months to use scholarship before expiration
