I. CALL TO ORDER

• Paula Panganiban called the meeting to order at 9:01 a.m.

IV. EMS/HEM REPORT

- COVID case rates are climbing significantly. They have tripled since last month and that indicates we are in a surge. Hospitalizations have also tripled, and ICU admits are up as well. Public Health tracks SNF outbreaks and those numbers have doubled from a month ago. The Omicron variant is still the predominant variant, except its sub-variant, the BQ variant, have now taken over the BA5 variant. The vaccine does cover the newer variant, however, only one in six people have gotten the booster in California. It has been authorized by the FDA for six months and above. Monoclonal antibodies are no longer recommended and have lost their emergency use authorization. Influenza has started an early and significant surge. Orange County's numbers are the highest in the last decade. The vaccine is about 50% effective. Flu vaccine uptake has been low. RSV has mainly impacted kids, but we have also seen a significant impact on the elderly. Monkey Pox has dwindled down, as well has Ebola. Respiratory viruses have been putting pressure on our systems. We have seen higher diversion hours and ambulance off-load times.
- The AOC is activated Monday Friday from 9am to 4pm. We are accepting resource requests, but remember
 most resources are available from your vendors, so reach out to them first before reaching out to the AOC.
 CDPH has allocated Influenza/COVID-19 antigen test kits for professional use available to SNFs generally
 because they have CLIA waivers. There weren't that many tests given to Orange County.
- The RDD After Action Report will be out soon. Chad Cossey and Eddie Morales are building a training calendar for the upcoming year. Please let them know of any training needs. ccossey@ochca.com or emorales@ochca.com. Coalition Agreements are currently being updated. A full-scale exercise has been requested for Spring 2023.

I. CALL TO ORDER

• Dr. Gagandeep Grewal called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m.

II. INTRODUCTIONS/ANNOUNCEMENTS

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

• The March 9, 2022 minutes were approved

IV. EMS/HEM REPORT

- COVID positivity case rates are still going down 13 per 100,000; hospitalizations are down as well
- SNF/LTC outbreaks are also down
- The predominant strain is still Omicron, however we have swapped variants
- The variant went from BA1 to BA2 and now it swapped over to BA5. There's another variant cropping up, BA4.6 and that is not a big issue yet in California
- The new booster that was just released covers both the BA4 and BA5 variants
- Influenza is flattening out in OC
- The CDC issued a Respiratory Virus warning in children
- Monkey Pox cases are rising; 170 cases in OC; LA reported their first death last week. It should be leveling off fairly soon
- The AOC is still activated, supporting logistics for Mobile POD vaccinations; the process is winding down
- We have a limited supply of BinaxNOW professional use test kits available for SNF/LTC facilities. Please let us know if you need any of these.
- We still have a large allocation of over the counter iHealth test kits available. We are limiting distribution of these to those who are serving the disadvantaged population or uninsured. Please reach out to us if any of these apply to you.
- The warehouse is downsizing, and we have a lot of PPE available. Mainly gowns and facemasks. If you have a need for any of these supplies, please let us know.
- HEM has filled two positions to help us on various projects, plans, exercises, and drills
- We are trying to get more funding to bring back Hal Kempfer, a subject matter expert in disaster & emergency preparedness.
- We are also working on getting participation up in these coalition meetings

- SNF/LTC Accepting Patients from Acute Care Hospitals
 - o Donna Meyer stated SNFs are not permitted to receive patients if they are having an outbreak

- Cherry Fontela mentioned that is rare these days that they completely close down a facility due to an outbreak.
- o Dr. Grewal suggested having MOUs in place for this sort of situation and using Reddinet
