Program Highlights

Adult & Older Services (includes Behavioral Health housing):

- Co located services at the Hero Landing Supportive Housing Project have successfully linked 5 veterans to outpatient mental health and SUD services this month.
- The Older adult program assisted 6 homeless older adult SMI clients in getting into stable housing this month.
- On June 12, 2023, HomeAid Orange County hosted the Francis Xavier Groundbreaking Ceremony. This housing project is in the City of Santa Ana and has 16 Mental Health Services Act dedicated units and one manager's unit.
- On June 21, 2023, National CORE in partnership with Mercy House celebrated the Grand Opening of the Legacy Square apartments, located in the City of Santa Ana. This housing project has 93 Total Units of new construction of which 16 are funded through the Mental Health Services Act for unhoused individuals with SMI.

Forensics:

- Working with the State Department of Hospitals (DSH) on Emergency Access to Stabilization Services (EASS) in the jail, slated to open in a few months for Felony Incompetent to Stand Trial (1370s).
- Working with the DSH IMO (Involuntary Medication Order) task force to initiate implementation of an IMO plan for OC, pursuant to new penal code language change effective 7/1/23 which will get felony 1370's medicated quicker at Orange County Jail. This plan includes education of stakeholders including bench officers, sheriff's department, correctional health services, etc.
- Implemented 1370 Felony Diversion track first cases granted diversion this month

Outreach & Engagement (O&E):

Successfully reversed another overdose in Hart Park in Orange. A bystander notified
the O&E team that an individual was unresponsive and that they had already used one
Narcan on him. The team immediately deployed Narcan, called 911, began CPR and
were able to revive the gentleman, who was transported via ambulance to the hospital.

Substance Use Disorder:

• DUI and Drug Court graduate 16 individuals from the program

 Coordinated the Opioid Abatement Plan purchase of 7,500 units of Kloxxado (8mg dose of Narcan) and have begun deployment. Created a system to deploy Narcan and Kloxxado independent of an educational community event.

Office of Wellness & Suicide Prevention:

- Created a Media Guide for reporting Suicide.
- Light Up Hope OC has been awarded two international Vega Awards, for excellence in the planning and execution of digital communications.

HIGHLIGHT of the Month

The Office of Wellness & Suicide Prevention, working with contract provider US Vets, outreaches to Veterans and their allies to address suicide by firearms. Over the past two months, the US Vets team of Veteran Peers has been conducting outreach to Orange County gun shops and ranges sharing resources and information in support of the reduction of suicide by firearms. They have also attended and tabled community events throughout the County, sharing information with veterans and military connected community members about firearms safety. Within the last 30 days of starting this outreach, US Vets has distributed more than 200 gun locks and Prevent Firearm Suicide brochures created by the Community Suicide Prevention Initiative (CSPI) a network of stakeholders, led by the MHRS Office of Wellness & Suicide Prevention.
