## To receive help from the services listed in this brochure, you must be living with HIV.

#### ASSISTANCE FOR PAYMENTS FOR RENT, MORTGAGE, OR UTILITIES

(Individuals receiving Section 8, Rental Assistance Program (RAP), Continuum of Care (CoC), are <u>not</u>eligible for assistance for payments for Rent, Mortgage or Utilities.)

#### Emergency Financial Assistance for Rent, Mortgage, or Utility Payments:

Payments are capped at \$300 a year for utilities and up to one (1) month of Fair Market Rent in Orange County<sup>1</sup> depending on household size per year for rent/mortgage. To get this service:

- Your income must be under 80% of area median income. <sup>2</sup>
- You must show that you have an emergency need for assistance and do not have enough to pay for rent, mortgage or utilities.

#### Short-Term Assistance with Rent (STAR):

Provides assistance every three (3) months. Rent or mortgage payments can be up to an identified percentage<sup>2</sup> of Fair Market Rent for Orange County<sup>1</sup> depending on household size per year for rent. This service is capped at 21 weeks in a 52-week period. There is a five (5) year time period limit.

To get this service:

- Your income must be under 80% of area median income.<sup>2</sup>
- You must show that you have an emergency need for assistance and do not have enough to pay for rent.

### ASSISTANCE WITH DEPOSITS FOR RENT AND UTILITIES

# Emergency Financial Assistance for Rent or Utility Deposits:

Help with deposits for rent and/or utilities. This service is capped at \$2,500 in a five (5) year time period limit. To get this service:

- Your income must be under 80% of area median income.<sup>2</sup>
- You must show that you have an emergency need for assistance and do not have enough to pay deposits for rent or utilities.

## **TEMPORARY HOUSING**

## Short-Term Supportive Housing:

Temporary housing in a hotel, motel, or recovery residence (sober living) for up to 240 days in a 24month period for persons who:

- 1. Are homeless or at risk of being homeless;
- 2. Are coming from emergency housing, mental health and/or drug treatment programs; or

3. Were recently released from jail/prison. Housing staff will work with you to make a housing plan to get you into stable housing.

To get this service:

- Your income must be under 80% of area median income or 500% Federal Poverty Level (FPL) (whichever is lowest).
- You must be a client under Case Management.
- Individuals with past or current drug use may be placed in a recovery residence (sober living).

## HOUSING SUPPORT SERVICES

(Your income must be under 80% of area median income.)

#### **Housing Coordination:**

Housing information and referrals.

## Life Skills Classes:

Classes for learning living skills, communication skills, and how to access community resources.

- Positive U (English) is on the 1st and 3rd Thursday of every month.
- Viviendo Positivamente is on the 2nd and 4th Thursday of each month.

## Fair Market Rent is determined by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

## PERMANENT HOUSING PROGRAMS

#### (You must get on a waiting list for Permanent Housing Programs.)

**Casa Alegre Apartments** - Studio apartments in Anaheim.

To get this service:

• You must be disabled due to any condition.

**Emmanuel Residence** - Bedrooms in a home in Santa Ana.

To get this service:

• Your income must be under 50% of area median income.<sup>2</sup>

**Hagan Place** - One-bedroom apartments in Laguna Beach.

To get this service:

• You must be disabled due to HIV and your income must be under 80% of area median income.<sup>2</sup>

**Louis Martin** - Bedroom in a house in Santa Ana. To get this service:

• You must be disabled due to HIV and your income must be under 80% of area median income.<sup>2</sup>

**Kairos House** - Shared or private bedroom in a home in Anaheim.

To get this service:

• You may need to pay a part of the rent based on your income.

**San Miguel** - Permanent housing unit in Santa Ana. To get this service:

• You must meet income requirements. Individuals can be referred from Mercy House programs.

## **OTHER HOUSING SERVICES**

## Rental Assistance Program (RAP):

RAP provides monthly help with rent, like Section 8. To get this service:

- Your income must be under 80% of area median income.<sup>2</sup>
- Please contact your case manager or Radiant Health Centers for an application to get on the waitlist.

## Continuum of Care (CoC):

CoC is a permanent housing program that provides help with rent, like Section 8.

To get this service:

- You must be homeless, meet income requirements, and have certain disabilities (like HIV/AIDS, substance abuse, and/or serious mental illness, etc.).
- You must be referred by your case manager.
