Ι. **CALL TO ORDER**

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III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Minutes from the November 14, 2023, meeting was approved as submitted.

IV. OCEMS REPORT

OCEMS Report by Carl Schultz, MD

Dr. Schultz sent out two memos in regard to the language in policy 310.96. The first issue has to do with taking a patient out of the emergency department once they have been brought in, put back into an ambulance and sent to another hospital. That is not okay. You cannot take a patient out of the emergency department or out of the waiting room, any other patient care facility that is established by the hospital, including a tent, once they have been brought in. They are now marginally under the supervision of the hospital, and you cannot take they out and put them back into an ambulance. You can put them in a waiting room or on a cot, but those are your only options. The second point, the hospitals have seen one of the requirements that said if you remain in the ambulance, you may leave and go to another facility. If the patient is on the ramp for an hour, you can put them back in the ambulance and take them somewhere else.

ReddiNet cannot be used as a way to turn down patients. If you are up, you must take that patient. You can go down after you accept that patient.

- Specialty Centers (CCERC, SNRC, CVRC, Trauma)
 No updates.
- Ambulance Patient Off-Load Time (APOT) and Diversion Report by *Laurent Repass*APOT and diversion were fairly normal for October and November. APOT and diversion numbers were higher for December with the seasonal flu, COVID and RSV going around. APOT numbers for December were 38 minutes and 11 seconds at the 90th percentile. We set a new record for 911 transports at 17,195 to hospitals throughout the county. Regarding diversion, for the past two months we were right at the 6% mark, for December we were at 13.5%.
- Bi-Directional Data Exchange Project by Laurent Repass

We have eleven hospitals that have completed the project and are on the Bi-Directional Data Exchange. By the end of February, we should have an additional 6 hospitals. We are hoping to get the remaining hospitals done by the end of the fiscal year. The project due date is June 30th.

VI. **NEW BUSINESS**

Mission Hospital Request for Approval of a 3 Year Designation by Genise Silva, RN
 In November, the team went out to Mission hospital to do five of their redesignations – their Emergency Receiving Center, their Children's Comprehensive Emergency Receiving Center, their Cardiovascular Receiving Center, their Stroke Neuro Receiving Center, as well as their

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Base Hospital designation. It was very thorough, and we didn't find any deficiencies. We are asking for a three-year unconditional designation. We feel that there is always room for improvement, so we have listed some recommendations.

- Continue to monitor diversion and APOT
- 2. Continue to provide great pediatric education

Genise asked for a motion for a three-year unconditional designation for these five areas for Mission Hospital. Motion approved.

Discussion on 911 Providers by Carl Schultz, MD

When transporting patients from a facility to an out-of-county facility are not processes that we can support. They take providers out of service for long periods of time and places the patients in jeopardy because 911 paramedics have limits to what they can do. Doing this is an unacceptable practice. There is a line in the sand about using 911 providers to move an inpatient to a non-Orange County facility at a great distance from the county, essentially pulling them out of service for a long period of time. Should that occur, please inform Dr. Schultz right away.
