More Ways to Get Involved

In addition to the HIV Planning Council, there are four (4) subcommittees that work to meet the HIV needs in Orange County.

HIV Client Advocacy Committee (HCAC)

- Meets on the 3rd Monday of the month at 6pm
- Members are PLWH
- Help identify the needs of the community
- Represent other PLWH who cannot be a part of the planning process

Executive Committee

- Meets on the 1st Wednesday of the month at 6pm
- Members are HIV Planning Council members
- Advises the HIV Planning Council and ensures responsibilities are being met
- Monitors how quickly funds are distributed for HIV services

Committees open to all: Integrated Plan Committee

- Meets on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 6pm
- Develops the Integrated HIV Prevention and Care Plan to help end HIV
- Provide ideas to improve HIV care services

Priority Setting, Allocations, and Planning (PSAP) Committee

- Meets on the 4th Wednesday of the month at 6pm
- Develops HIV service priorities
- Recommends how to distribute funding for HIV services by reviewing data
