

Roles and Responsibilities for Three-Year BH Integrated Plan Development

Board of Supervisors	Approval of the local Behavioral Health Integrated Plan (BHIP).
OC Executive Management	Review and approval of draft BHIP for submission to BOS.
BHS Executive Management/Leadership	Review plan for adherence to requirements, alignment across system, and recommend final plan for submission.
Behavioral Health Advisory Board	Act in advisory capacity to BHS Director, host public hearing to affirm compliance with regulations, host listening sessions, support selection of community co-chairs for BHSA Component Ad hoc Workgroups, assign BHAB member to participate and report out on CPP.
BHSA Internal Planning	Oversee CPP process, plan development, ensure technical and regulatory requirements are met, program implementation, evaluation, and reporting; ensure programs are interconnected to support system development.
Planning Advisory Committee	The BHSA Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) is a structured way for individual stakeholders to share their opinions and perspectives, study programs, services, and issues, and develop recommendations in a focused, group structure. The recommendations accumulate over time and are kept as part of BHS' record, as recommendations cannot always result in immediate or future action.
Behavioral Health Equity Committee	The Behavioral Health Equity Committee (BHEC) ensures that BHS addresses the needs of underserved and marginalized communities in Orange County. The BHEC consists of subcommittees for various cultural populations who meet to identify needs for their respective communities and provide recommendations to the Behavioral Health Director to improve the quality and delivery of Behavioral Health Services within the County. Subcommittees can be added to reflect the priority populations and their intersectionality with other cultural factors.
Behavioral Health Services and Supports (BHSS) Component Workgroup	Group will meet once a month at a minimum to develop and review ideas and present recommendations at BHSA PAC meetings for the BHIP. Group members will focus on early intervention, outreach and engagement, workforce education and training, capital facilities and technological needs, and innovative pilots and projects under the new requirements of Proposition 1.
Full-Service Partnership (FSP) Component Workgroup	Group will meet once a month at a minimum to develop and review ideas and present recommendations at BHSA PAC meetings for the BHIP. Group members will focus on FSPs to assist the most vulnerable individuals by providing intensive, community-based outpatient services for individuals who have the greatest barriers to accessing care under the new requirements of Proposition 1.
Housing Component Workgroup	Group will meet once a month at a minimum to develop and review ideas and present recommendations at BHSA PAC meetings for the BHIP. Group members will focus on housing interventions that support the range of needs for target populations and help provide stable housing in coordination with care, to improve health outcomes under the new requirements of Proposition 1.



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Substance Use Disorder (SUD)	Group will be interspersed throughout the other 3 component workgroups. Group members will focus on SUD services that support the range of needs for target populations and help provide assertive field-based initiation programs that proactively engage individuals with SUD and offer low barrier access to MAT, to improve health outcomes under the new requirements of Proposition 1.
Workgroup Co-Chair	Each of the BHSS, FSP and Housing Component Workgroups will be led by (2) Co-Chair appointees, as approved by the OCHCA BHS Director, to provide organizational support, leadership, report outs at PAC meetings, and subject matter expertise for each Component Workgroup. Co-Chairs will have an understanding of BHSA and DHCS regulations and be able to provide leadership and direction for each of the workgroups as well as make recommendations to the PAC. Co-Chairs will be appointed to a 12-month term of volunteer service.
Workgroup Stakeholder Open Participation	Each Component Workgroup is an open public meeting in which local stakeholders will be invited to support in the contribution of ideas, goals, and the development of topics and discussion to improve the County's overall behavioral health integrated system under the BHSA.
