Description: The Anger Management Program is typically a 10, 12, 22, 26 or 52-week program (the length can be adjusted to meet the referring party's needs) that is either mandated by court/probation or can be attended on a volunteer basis. The group is co-ed and meets once a week for an hour and a half. During the program the client will learn the tools to effectively deal with escalating situations and learn skills to help them manage their own anger impulses. Group discussions include understanding passive, assertive and aggressive behaviors, problem solving techniques, learning the connection between thought, emotions and behaviors, relaxation techniques, timeouts and taking responsibility for one's actions. Clients must demonstrate

that they have mastered the curriculum and the meaning of the curriculum by interacting with the group facilitator and other peers in the group. This program is currently being offered in our Newport Beach office.

Description: The AB 109 program provides a continuum of mental health, crisis and recovery services to AB 109 adults (non-serious, non-violent, and non-sex offenders) who have mental health and/or substance use issues and are being released from state prison or county jail. Individuals are identified through a collaborative effort by the Orange County Probation Department and HCA.

Upon release, individuals who meet criteria for AB 109 and have behavioral health issues are referred by a Probation Office to OC Health Care Agency (HCA) Mental Health, Crisis & Recovery Services (MHRS). A MHRS AB 109 screener who is co-located at Probation meets with the individual, identifies the most appropriate level of care services, and connects that individual to appropriate services. Services are voluntary and designed to promote and support the individual’s recovery.

Lead is a toxic heavy metal used in many products over time. Lead poisoning is one of the most common and preventable environmental diseases in children. Preventing exposure to lead is critical. CLPPP provides case management and environmental investigations, community outreach, and education regarding environmental lead exposures. CLPPP aims to reduce lead hazards where children live, play, learn, and spend time.

There is no safe level of lead. Even small amount of lead can cause learning and behavior problems for children. Some of these health

problems can last a lifetime, including: brain and nervous system damage, slow growth and development, and hearing and speech problems. Children with lead poisoning do not look or act sick. Blood testing is the only way to determine if a child has lead poisoning. Most private and public health insurance (including Medi-Cal) will pay for testing.

Launched in 1994, Families and Communities Together (FaCT) is a network of 15 Family Resource Centers (FRCs) located throughout Orange County's highest-risk communities providing essential family support services, education and resources. FaCT is administered by the County of Orange Social Services Agency, in partnership with Charitable Ventures.

Charitable Ventures facilitates the planning, implementation, evaluation and support of services and activities that maximize the benefits offered by the FRCs. Programs and services receive funding from federal, state and county agencies including U.S. Department of Health and Human Services-Promoting Safe and Stable Families, the County of Orange Social Services Agency, California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs), as well as volunteer, in-kind support and private donations.

What is a FaCT Family Resource Center?

Each FRC is a family-friendly, community-based site that provides access to comprehensive prevention and treatment-oriented social, educational and health services for all families, including birth, blended, kinship, adoptive and foster families. FRCs serve as vehicles for engaging local residents and community organizations in the identification and resolution of community concerns related to raising healthy children. Every FRC is unique to its community; services are offered by multicultural and multilingual staff that reflect the surrounding neighborhoods and the families they serve.

PUBLIC GUARDIAN

Mission Statement:

The Public Guardian is responsible for the care of individuals who are no longer able to make decisions or care for themselves. A conservatorship is a legal process where a 3rd party (conservator) is given the legal authority to manage the financial affairs and/or the care of another individual (conservatee).

The Superior Court determines whether a person is unable to care and make decisions for themselves and whether a conservatorship is appropriate. Once appointed by the court, the Public Guardian assumes personal and/or financial responsibilities for care of the conservatee and their needs and assets.

The Office of The Public Guardian provides assistance in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. Hours of operation are from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday. For more information, call (714) 567-7660.

The Public Guardian oversees 2 types of conservatorships: Probate and Lanterman-Short-Petris (LPS).

Probate conservatorship are established for individuals who are unable to care for themselves or are subject to physical, mental or financial abuse where no other alternative exists. Often these individuals suffer from dementia, traumatic brain injury or other cognitive impairments.

LPS conservatorships are established for individuals who are mentally ill and or experiencing severe substance use disorder and who have been deemed gravely disabled.

If you answered **YES**, this guide is for you!

There are many organizations throughout Orange County that provide car seat safety resources and services. The tables on the following pages include what each organization offers. Information on this page has a brief description of each type of service or resource you will see in this guide.

OC Child Passenger Safety Resource Guide

Where can I get a free car seat?

Many organizations provide car seats, some free of charge, to families who need a little extra help. Contact the organizations listed to see if you qualify. Supplies are limited. The types of car seats that each organization offers are shown in this guide.

Where can I have my car seat checked?

Are you wondering if your car seat is installed in your car correctly? Is your child fitting correctly in his/her seat? Many organizations have trained experts called *Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Technicians*, who provide education and training. They will help you feel confident in installing your car seat correctly and ensuring your child is safely and properly secured.

Who can I go to with questions?

CPS Technicians have been trained and nationally certified on the topic of car seat safety. They can spot problems and know specific details about seats and cars on the market. They can also ensure that a child is in the correct seat for their age, height, and weight. Contact a *CPS Technician* with questions you might have about car seat safety.

Where can I take a car seat safety class?

Classes are offered throughout the county. Contact the organizations listed for times and locations.

What is Kaitlyn's Law?

Did you know that it is illegal to leave an unsupervised child, age six or younger, inside a car if: the engine is running, the keys are in the ignition, or the child's health or safety is at risk? A person who is 12 or older may supervise. Many organizations provide information about this important law and safety risk.

Where can I find a violator class?

Did you receive a traffic ticket related to car seats or leaving a child alone in a car? Did a judge direct you to take a car seat safety class? You can take a violator class and your fine may be waived or reduced. In addition, you will learn valuable information about keeping your child safe in your car.
